## **DALE M. BURR – Artist & Sculptor**

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Dale Burr has been at the canvas for forty years. His work, characterized by heavy paint strokes, broken brushwork and a fascination with light and color, describes a lifelong passion for the outdoors. Dale grew up in West Yellowstone, Montana, an area of the country that presented endless opportunities for studying wildlife and nature. His peaceful yet powerful landscape oils tell the story of a relationship with nature known only to a man who has lived countless hours fly-fishing on the Madison, the Yellowstone and other rivers of the region.

Dale began to sculpt in the mid 70's and in so doing, found a new vehicle with which he could express his artistic idea. Dale was awarded the prestigious "Best Bronzed Sculptor" award at the George Phippin Memorial Art Show, a nationwide gathering of artists in Prescott, Arizona. His other works include awe-inspiring garden fountains and outdoor monuments. Dale owns and operates his own foundry – evidence of his dedication to the process of hand casting his art.

Much of Dale's work is greatly inspired by recent trips to Europe. The paintings capture moments walking through small villages and peaceful countrysides of France and Switzerland. Soft flowers and garden settings (including a visit to Giverny, the estate which is home to Monet's famous lily ponds and gardens) are among the themes represented in his latest collection of paintings.

Although his artwork has been widely recognized and rewarded, Dale will be the first to tell you that his greatest accomplishment is the six children that he and his supportive wife Doneen raised while promoting his career. Dale and his wife now live in Teton Valley, Idaho, an area of constant inspiration due to the ever-changing elements and frequent visits of wildlife. Dale's work will be on display at Sweetwater Restaurant starting March 18<sup>th</sup> and can also be seen in selected galleries in Jackson, Wyoming.



Mary Lou / Ashley - The corner artwork was elected as an alternative to meeting the following standard: Corner Buildings: Corner buildings shall have corner entrances, or shall provide a covered walkway extending from the corner of the building to its primary entrance, which shall be not more than forty feet from the street corner. Where there is not an alcove or larger civic space there on the corner, maybe it does make sense to locate the art in the small plaza by the main entry. But, then, what to do with the concrete pad?
