

this event is good "old-fashioned" family fun for all ages. It takes place in a round pen filled with wet mud. A barrel is set in the center of the pen and a pig is turned loose in it. The object is for a 4-person team to catch the pig and then place the pig in the barrel, rear-end first, in the shortest amount of time, working under a one minute time limit. Rules of the event prohibit anything or action which may cause harm to the pig. The barrel is partially filled with bedding which pads the pig's rear end when placed in the barrel. Spectators cheer their favorite teams on while the local fire fighters stand by to hose off the muddy contestants. This event is open to the public to the following age groups. #### The goal of the 4-H Shooting and Archery

program is to teach safe and responsible use of firearms and archery equipment including sound decision making, self-discipline and concentration. We promote the highest standards of safety, sportsmanship and ethical behavior and expose participants to the broad array of vocational and life-long avocation and activities related to shooting sports.

The 4-H Shooting and Archery Show features youth ages 8 – 18 who compete in shooting and archery events. Youth in this event show off their shooting skills from 20 to 30m (juniors), 20 to 40m (intermediate), 30 to 60m (seniors). 3-D targets are shot at different distances for each group. As youth step up to the firing line, they listen for commands to fire at will while taking aim at the bulls eye.

The 4-H Working Ranch Horse Program helps participants expand knowledge and skills with horses. Working cattle with horses is very rewarding for the rider and the horse. Horses, like humans, need to have a job and a goal to achieve. In this program, youth and leaders are encouraged to learn about natural horsemanship. Horse and handler bond through communication and understanding of the horse's natural instincts.

Youth are involved in western horsemanship activities beyond traditional show ring. They learn age-old techniques of handling livestock while on horseback. They also learn leadership and responsibility that come through being engaged in 4-H. Everyone gains insight into the world of cowboys and buckaroos.

The 4-H Working Ranch Horse Show features youth ages 8 – 18 enrolled in the Working Ranch 4-H Club. Competitions are in categories that relate to real life cattle ranching skills including: dummy roping, tracking a cow, sorting and penning cattle and roping heads and heels.

#### \$25/ENTRY 2 Draws per Entry

We have two new events this year at the fair. Ranch Sorting and Team Penning. These will both take place on the same night. We will start at 6:00 pm, so please bring your horses for a night of fun.

Ranch sorting and its sister discipline, team penning, are regulated by the United States Team Penning Association (USTPA), headquartered in Ft. Worth, Texas. The USTPA was founded in 1993 in Fort Worth with the purpose of attracting more participants and educating them to the sports of Team Penning and Ranch Sorting.

At the beginning, there are eleven calves at the end of one of the pens with numbers on their sides for identification. The judge raises the flag and when the riders cross the gap between the two pens the clock starts and the competition begins The team of two riders have to move the cattle one at a time from one pen to the other in numerical order, starting with a random number called by the judge.The fastest time wins. If a calf gets from one pen to the other out of order, then the team is disqualified.

Team Penning is similar competition except that a team of three riders on horseback have from 60 to 75 seconds to separate three cattle from a herd and put them into a single pen. To register call 208-399-2223.

#### 4-H POULTRY & RABBIT SHOW

The 4-H Poultry & Rabbit show features animals raised by local 4-H kids to compete in breed or market classes. The show is divided into two parts first, the animals are judged on their breed or market qualifications; second, the kids are judged in a showmanship class on the grooming of their animal, knowledge of their breed and ability to show their animal to its best advantage. Rabbit showmanship requires the contestant to perform a demonstration of the rabbit's body and knowledge of the disgualifications for each part. Poultry that is judged in the market class is eligible to be sold at the livestock auction on Friday, August 12 at 6:00 pm.

# **11TH ANNUAL HORSE PULL**

Thursday, August 11th - 7pm – Outdoor Arena

Horse pulling goes back to the time when farming and ranching chores were accomplished with teams of horses lead by a driver called a teamster. The teamsters often challenged each other over who had the toughest and best team. These challenges migrated from farms and fields to the arena to determine the strongest team. There are three weight classes determined by the team's combined weight. Each team hooks on to a stone boat which is loaded with concrete weights. They pull between two ropes that are 16 feet apart and get two tries to pull the boat 20 feet. Those that pull the distance will come back to pull again with weights of 500 - 1000 lbs added each time. The team that pulls the most weight the farthest wins the weight class. It is a true test of athleticism, conditioning and skilled driving by the teamster.

The 4-H livestock show features market and showmanship classes for swine, sheep, goats and beef. In the market classes, kids show off their animals to their best advantage and

judges award ribbons based on condition and confirmation. Animals that have the best proportions, fat to muscle ratios and structure rank the highest. In the showmanship classes, kids demonstrate

their ability to groom their animal, their skill at setting their animal up to highlight its best features, and their overall knowledge of their livestock project.



## **4-H LIVESTOCK SALE**

The 4-H Livestock Sale offers premium, locally grown meat for purchase at a lively, round-pen auction. Animals raised by local 4-H kids are shown at the fair and the whole animal is sold at the auction to the highest bidder. Buyers who purchase an animal, write a check for the purchase amount at the time of sale and select a local butcher on a sale form. The butcher picks up the animal at the fair and the buyer picks up their packaged meat within 3-4 weeks of the fair. A market floor price is established on the day of the sale and the difference between the floor price and the sale price can be taken as a charitable deduction.

Many local businesses and families support the sale and fill their freezers with local, lean, delicious and healthy meat. Animals are hand raised by the 4-H kids and get plenty of exercise and love. They are fed a wholesome grain and protein diet purchased from local feed stores or hand milled by the 4-H kids. Many kids raise multiple animals for many years and save the money earned to help with college expenses. 4-H kids who raise livestock projects learn valuable lessons of responsibility, commitment and follow-through. They are required to keep track of their project records, develop income and expense spreadsheets, demonstrate their livestock knowledge in a group setting, complete a community service project and attend club meetings.

Buyer's who do not wish to take the meat can sell the animal back to the fair on the night of the sale for the floor price and take the charitable deduction. The local food bank and senior center will also take packaged meat as a donation if you don't have enough room in your freezer for the whole animal.



Figure 8 racing takes place on an 8 shaped track that purposely intersects itself increasing the risk of collisions. Because of this layout, crashes are inevitable and drivers must pay strict attention to detail and timing to successfully navigate the "X". The cars used are often standard cars, but are usually modified for lightness and safety, by removing the window glass and often adding a roll cage. Competitors come from throughout the region to race and the night is filled with bright lights, loud sounds, a cheering crowd and adrenaline. 
