Pig wrestling is sponsored by the local 4-H program and is an event that is good "old-fashioned" family fun for all ages. The event takes place in a round pen filled with wet mud. A barrel is set in the center of the pen and a pig is turned loose in it. The object is for a 4-person team to catch the pig and then place the pig in the barrel, rear-end first, in the shortest amount of time, working under a one minute time limit. Rules of the event prohibit anything or action which may cause harm to the pig. The barrel is partially filled with bedding which pads the pig's rear end when placed in the barrel. Spectators cheer their favorite teams on while the local fire fighters stand by to hose off the muddy contestants. This event is open to the public to the following age groups. Local business teams, matching t-shirts and costumes are encouraged. For team registration, rules and entry fees, call the 4-H Extension Office at 354-2961. Concessions are available at the event.





4-H WORKING Ranch

The 4-H Working Ranch Horse Program is designed to help participants expand their knowledge and skills with horses. Using horses to work with cattle is very rewarding not only for the rider, but also the horse. Horses, like humans, need to have a job and a goal to achieve. There are innumerable "schools of thought" when it comes to horsemanship. In this program youth and leaders are encouraged to learn about natural horsemanship. This is the concept of horse and handler bonding through communication and understanding of the horses' natural instincts.

Youth are involved in western horsemanship activities beyond the traditional show ring. Participants learn the age-old techniques of handling livestock while on horseback, as well as the leadership and responsibility that comes with being engaged in 4-H. Everyone gains insight into the world of cowboys and buckaroos.

The 4-H Working Ranch Horse Show features youth ages 8 – 18 enrolled in the Working Ranch 4-H Club. Competitions are in categories that relate to real life cattle ranching skills including: dummy roping, how to track a cow, sorting and penning cattle and roping heads and heels. 4-H DOG Show

Thursday
August 7th, 8am



In this project area of interest, youth learn... different aspects of dog fancy: about different breeds, colors, and groups of dogs: careers involving dogs: how to care for, groom, and show a dog: proper nutrition, first aid, and health of dogs: the names for dog anatomy and lingo used in dog industries: diseases, anatomy, and behavior of dogs: how to teach behaviors and change bad habits of dogs and puppies.

The 4-H Dog Show highlights skills in exercises that youth have learned with their dogs such as heel, sit, stay, down and figure 8 while on and off the leash. In showmanship classes, youth show off their grooming talents and knowledge.

4-H Poultry & Rabbit Show

Thursday

The 4-H Poultry & Rabbit show features animals raised by local 4-H kids to compete in breed or market classes. The show is divided into two parts – first, the animals are judged on their breed or market qualifications; second, the kids are judged in a showmanship class on the grooming of their animal, knowledge of their breed and ability to show their animal to its best advantage. Rabbit showmanship requires the contestant to perform a demonstration of the rabbit's body and knowledge of the disqualifications for each part. Poultry that is judged in the market class is eligible to be sold at the livestock auction on Friday, August 8 at 6:00 pm.

Cattle Creek Ranch supports the 4-H Livestock Sale and the values that 4-H Livestock Projects develop in our youth.

In the showmanship classes, kids demonstrate their ability to groom their animal, their skill at setting their animal up to highlight its best features, and their overall knowledge of their livestock project.




Join 4-H

4-H LIVESTOCK Sale

Friday
August 8th, 6pm

The 4-H Livestock Sale offers premium, locally grown meat for purchase at a lively, round-pen auction. Animals raised by local 4-H kids are shown at the fair and the whole animal is sold at the auction to the highest bidder. Buyers who purchase an animal, write a check for the purchase amount at the time of sale and select a local butcher on a sale form. The butcher picks up the animal at the fair and the buyer picks up their packaged meat within 3-4 weeks of the fair. A market floor price is established on the day of the sale and the difference between the floor price and the sale price can be taken as a charitable deduction.



Many local businesses and families support the sale and fill their freezers with local, lean, delicious and healthy meat. Animals are hand raised by the 4-H kids and get plenty of exercise and love. They are fed a wholesome grain and protein diet purchased from local feed stores or hand milled by the 4-H kids. Many kids raise multiple animals for many years and save the money earned to help with college expenses. 4-H kids who raise livestock projects learn valuable lessons of responsibility, commitment and follow-through. They are required to keep track of their project records, develop income and expense spreadsheets, demonstrate their livestock knowledge in a group setting, complete a community service project and attend club meetings.

Buyer's who do not wish to take the meat can sell the animal back to the fair on the night of the sale for the floor price and take the charitable deduction. The local food bank and senior center will also take packaged meat as a donation if you don't have enough room in your freezer for the whole animal.




Horse pulling goes back to the time when farming and ranching chores were accomplished with teams of horses lead by a driver called a teamster. The teamsters often challenged each other over who had the toughest and best team. These challenges migrated from farms and fields to the arena to determine the strongest team. There are three weight classes determined by the team's combined weight. Each team hooks on to a stone boat which is loaded with concrete weights. They pull between two ropes that are 16 feet apart and get two tries to pull the boat 20 feet. Those that pull the distance will come back to pull again with weights of 500 – 1000 lbs added each time. The team that pulls the most weight the farthest wins the weight class. It is a true test of athleticism, conditioning and skilled driving by the teamster.



Teton County has a lot of farms!

There are 291 farms in Teton County. They farm over 68% of all private lands in the county (over 133,199 acres).

More farmers are living on their farms.

Today, 78% of Teton County's farmers live on their farms. That is almost a 5% increase from 2007.

These farms have internet.

Over 82% of these farms have internet access, which is higher than the national household average of 71% internet access.

Teton County's farmers have farmed a long time.

The average tenure for a farmer in Teton County is 22.1 years on his or her current farm.

Teton County's farms are growing larger and more valuable:


In 2007, the average farm size in Teton County was 410 acres. Through 2012 it grew over 10% to 452 acres. In 2007, average market value of farmland and buildings in Teton County was \$1,497,180. Through 2012 it grew to \$1,506,743.

Women are farming in Teton County.

In Teton County, 13.5% of all farms (39 farms) have a woman as the principal operator. They farm 4,835 acres and sell an annual average of \$735,000 of agricultural products.

Teton County's specialized and organic farms have a strong presence in Southeast Idaho:

There are six USDA certified organic farms in Teton County. In 2012, they generated \$77,000 of organic product sales. Interestingly, 10 counties in Idaho reported zero organic farms or organic product sales, including our neighbors Madison County and Fremont County. Eight farms in Teton County marketed their products through Community Supported Agriculture (CSA), and 15 sold value-added commodities. Three local farms harvested biomass for use in renewable energy.


