Meeting was called to order @ 3:30pm.

Review/Approve September 5, 2017 Minutes: The minutes were reviewed and approved.

Old Business:

- A. Project Status Board - no update
- B. Teton County Continuity of Government Plan – Most of the agencies have submitted updates to the Plan. Several other agencies still need to respond.

New Business:

- A. 911 Dispatch Improvements – The 911 Dispatch system may need to be updated in order to coordinate new technology. The update to the system may take several phases in order to complete the entire system.
- B. All Hazard Mitigation Plan was discussed and the need to update the mitigation projects within the Plan in the month of December. Also, if cities and county departments could budget 25% of the matching funds for a project, the project would be in line for possible Grant funding.

Agency Reports: The only agency report updates were as follows:

Emergency Management: EM will be submitting a 2017 Hazard Mitigation Grant to purchase two portable generators and installation of manual transfer switches for essential facilities.

Teton Valley Hospital: A new CT has been ordered and will be installed by the end of the year.

Teton County Fire Protection District: As of October 2017, the District has reorganized the organization to include a Chief, Deputy Chief, three Battalion Chiefs in charge of two companies with 3 shifts.

Eastern Idaho Public Health: A new staff Planner has been hired.

Teton School District 401: the School District will hold an Earthquake class on October 19, 2017. Also, the School District is proposing a bond for the November 2017 Election. The Bond is for \$30.05 Million for new and renovated Elementary Schools, plus \$7.2 Million to expand Middle & High School, and add an auxiliary Gym at the High School. Secondary school renovations can only pass if the elementary school bond passes.
