Future Emergency Coordinators training was discussed.

**Agency Reports:** The only agency report updates were as follows:

Teton County Emergency Management: Teton County EM was awarded with a State grant for its Critical Power grant. An Electrical Design Engineering firm has been chosen and contract being processed.

City of Teton: The City-wide water replacement and installation project is completed.

Teton Valley Hospital: The Hospital is remodeling the former Thrift Store and will be used in the future by Hospital Marketing and Billing departments with approx. 10-15 personnel. The Board of Directors have approved a future hospital construction project. The location for this new facility has not been determined.

Idaho Office of Emergency Management: Mike Clements stated the State awards have been granted and all the counties have received grant funds. Mike is available to assist, if needed.

Teton School District 401: The District experienced a water quality occurrence at Tetonia Elementary School and follow-up testing has been negative. The District has provided a Stop the Bleed training to most of the staff in the District. They have ordered 80 kits that will be distributed throughout the District Schools.

Other Business: A comment was raised to change the LEPC meeting to 1pm. It was suggested that a survey be sent-out to the LEPC member and the results provided at the next LEPC meeting on December 3, 2018.
