**Meeting was called to order @ 3:30pm.**

**Review/Acceptance of February 6, 2018 Minutes:** The minutes were reviewed and accepted as presented.

### **Old Business:**

- A. 2018 LEPC Activity Status Board was updated with Spring Active Shooter Tabletop Exercise set date of May 10, 2018, and deleted School District presentation for March 6, 2018 which was presented.

### **New Business:**

- A. Rusty Devereaux from American Red Cross presented the 2017 relief efforts on the devastated and historic Harvey, Irma, and Maria hurricanes and the wildfires in California. Also Rusty explained the millions of Red Cross emergency shelters that were provided for these events. We have 9 emergency shelters in our region; Armory, Alta Elem, Driggs High School, Driggs Middle School, Rendezvous School, Victor Elem, County Fairgrounds, Tetonia Elem, St Francis of the Teton Episcopal Church. and 397 emergency shelters in the State of Idaho. Also available is an emergency shelter App to assist with the location of shelters in a given area.

- B. Monte Woolstenhulme from Teton Valley School District 401 presented the recent Bond that was passed for 30 million. Monte explained the construction of new and remodel schools in the District, and the funds allocated for each school.
- C. LEPC By-Laws discussion was moved to the April Agenda due to timing of this meeting.
- D. 911 Roll-Out for the Sheriff's Office was provided by John Leidorf who described the upgrade to the 911 Dispatch system.
- E. Training Opportunities on bomb prevention courses were passed out and briefly discussed.

**Agency Reports:** The only agency report updates were as follows:

Teton County Emergency Management: Set date of May 10, 2018 for the Spring Active Shooter Tabletop Exercise, and still moving forward with the HMPG DR4246 grant for the installation of transfer switches for critical facilities in Teton County, including Cities.

Teton County Sheriff: The Sheriff Office is fully staffed with Deputies and Dispatch.

Teton County Commissioners: a total of 4 CPR sessions have been held with a total of 48 staff members trained.

Teton County Road & Bridge: on May 19, 2018 a household clean-up day will be held at the Transfer Station at no charge to the residence.

Teton Valley Hospital: The new Victor Clinic may be completed and open at the end of July 2018. The Teton Valley Hospital in Driggs will receive new flooring.

Teton County Fire Protection District: Wildfire training has been provided.

American Red Cross: Smoke alarm applications and installations have been coming in from residence.

Eastern Idaho Public Health: The 2018 Public Health Rendezvous will be held on April 3 & 4, 2018. Several regional Public Health staff and EM's attending FEMA training in Alabama.

Teton County School District 401: Provided at this month's LEPC a presented the recent Bond that was passed for 37 million. Monte explained the construction of new and remodel schools in the District, and the funds allocated for each school.
