Review/Approve August 1, 2017 Minutes: The minutes were reviewed and modified by Hyrum Johnson clarifying City of Driggs Water Project has increased in scope and may be completed later in 2018, then accepted as presented.

A. Emergency Communication (911 Dispatch & Radio) Not Presented

B. Total Solar Eclipse Table Top After Action Report/Improvement Plan – The Improvement Plan was discussed and three (3) improvements were provided; 1. Eclipse Information Line policies and procedures, 2. Fire/tractor fire suppression concept, 3. WEA system to be explored.

Agency Reports: The only agency report updates were as follows:

Emergency Management: Mitigation Grant Process was discussed with an August 14, 2017 deadline for Letter of Intent. Explosion of mosquito population has occurred in Teton Valley.

Teton County Public Works: Idaho Transportation Department reviewing Teton County Public Works Transportation Plan for the Eclipse, and the request for “No Parking” Signs along Hwys. Buxton Street

will be closed during the Eclipse. Resources and personnel will be located in zones during the Eclipse. Reconstructing 6000 S. to 4500 S. will be performed after the Eclipse.

City of Driggs: City of Driggs Water Project has increased in scope and may be completed later in 2018. Huntsman Road will be closed during the Eclipse, and only available for emergency vehicles.

Teton Valley Hospital: A new CT will be installed by the end of the year, and ham radio operators will be set-up during the Eclipse.

Teton County Fire Protection District: The District and Forest Service were offered more barriers during the Eclipse by Teton County Public Works. New Ambulance 1 is on-line, and funded by Fire District. Burn Ban is in effect. No personnel leave until Eclipse has been completed.

American Red Cross: Nationally Red Cross is recognizing 75 to 100 million in the 14 State path of the Eclipse.

Eastern Idaho Public Health: Next Eastern Idaho Public Health Coalition meeting is set for September 21, 2017.
